RSC Resolution No. IV-A-14-2021

“ENJOINING THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS IN CALABARZON TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NATIONAL COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING SYSTEM ROLL-OUT IN 2022”

- WHEREAS,** Republic Act No. 11315 otherwise known as Community-Based Monitoring System Act was enacted on 17 April 2019, to institutionalize the conduct of a Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) in every city and municipality in the country;
- WHEREAS,** the CBMS shall: (a) generate updated and disaggregated data necessary in targeting beneficiaries; (b) conduct more comprehensive poverty analysis and needs prioritization; (c) provide information that will enable a system of public spending that warrants government allocations on areas and populace that are most wanting; (d) design appropriate policies and interventions; and (e) and monitor impact over time;
- WHEREAS,** each city and municipality will be the primary data collecting authority within its locality following the established statistical standards, guidelines and procedures;
- WHEREAS,** some local government units in CALABARZON expressed apprehensions and some were not able to participate in the previous consultations and stakeholders' forum conducted by Philippine Statistics Authority Region IV-A and Department of Interior and Local Government Region IV-A due to budgetary constraints and the pandemic situation;
- WHEREAS,** each city and municipality are enjoined to participate in the synchronized data collection on CBMS in order to generate poverty statistics at higher levels that will complement and supplement the local level data, and serve as basis in prioritizing social protection and poverty alleviation programs of the government;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion duly seconded, **BE IT RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED,** to enjoin the local government units in CALABARZON to participate in the national Community-Based Monitoring System roll out in 2022 through the Regional Development Council.

RESOLVED FURTHER, to request all the cities and municipalities to allocate budget for the conduct of CBMS in 2022, including the hiring of personnel and provision of equipment and supplies.
